


# Time To Get Your Passport Stamped!

**A Little History:** Prior to the formation of St. Mary's, the few Catholics travelled to St. Agatha for mass or were blessed to have a travelling missionary stop to say mass at a neighbouring Mission Station. St Mary's was founded in 1857 and is the oldest Roman Catholic parish in Kitchener (previously Berlin). On August 16, 1854, land for the church was purchased for \$200.00 from David Weber. By 1903, the Gothic style building was built for a cost of approximately \$90 000 and seated more than 1000 people. Father Edward Glowacki, C.R. was appointed pastor in 1860 and St. Mary's began its long stewardship under the Congregation of the Resurrection Fathers. Today, Father Toby Collins C.R. extends a warm welcome to all parishioners and pilgrims.
