Week of Prayer for Christian Unity - A message from Fr. Paul
This weekend we begin the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. This year there will be no liturgical celebration between the Forest Hill area Churches. During this week let us pray for our brothers and sisters in Christ, who share with our Catholic community our common concerns - locally, nationally and internationally. These include: homelessness and food insecurity, the environment and climate change, human trafficking, human rights, implementation of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission, and immigration. We unite ourselves to others of faith in prayer and action, to bring the Kingdom of God closer to our lived reality. This week, let us each make an effort this to remember in prayer our neighbouring congregations of Forest Hill United, Calvin Presbyterian, St. George Anglican, Highland Road Baptist, and Faith Lutheran.

2026 Officially Declared a Special Year of St. Francis!
As one door closes another one opens. On January 6th, Pope Leo XIV closed the final Holy Door at St. Peter's Basilica in Rome, during the Epiphany celebrations, ending the Jubilee year of Hope. Just four days later, he proclaimed a “Special Year of St. Francis” to commemorate the 800th anniversary of the saint’s death. What an honour to have a year dedicated to our church’s namesake! This extraordinary Jubilee Year serves as a spiritual continuation of the Ordinary Jubilee of 2025, focusing the world's attention on Assisi’s message of universal brotherhood. Pope Leo XIV emphasized that St. Francis’s life remains a relevant "authentic source of peace" in a time of modern conflict. The official inauguration was on January 10, 2026, at the Basilica of Our Lady of the Angels in Assisi, 2026 and will continue until January 10, 2027. There are six key themes from the Saint’s testament, which will serve as a roadmap for the year: Mercy, Prayer, Fraternity, Work, Peace and Blessing. Throughout the year, we will take a look at what each one means and how it relates to us today in modern times. We will also have a look at how this extraordinary event will be celebrated throughout the world! The Year of Saint Francis presents itself as a time of favor and grace, offered freely to all. The Holy Father expresses his hope that this jubilee will awaken in our hearts “feelings of Christian charity toward one’s neighbor and an authentic desire for harmony and peace among peoples.”

Eight centuries after his death, Saint Francis still calls the Church—and the world—to conversion. This Jubilee Year invites us not only to honor him, but to walk in his footsteps, rebuilding the Church through lives transformed by the Gospel.

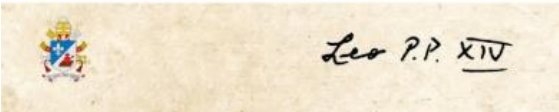
Prayer to Saint Francis for Peace
